## T: TOUCH

Look out for: changes in skin texture,  
appearance or direction of nipple or  
nipple discharge.

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# BREAST CANCER MYTH BUSTERS



**MYTH #1:**  
I DON'T HAVE A  
FAMILY HISTORY OF  
BREAST CANCER,  
SO I CAN'T GET IT.



Most people diagnosed with breast cancer have no known family history.

**MYTH #2:**  
INJURY TO THE  
BREAST CAN  
CAUSE CANCER.



There's no scientific evidence that injury to the breast can cause cancer.

**MYTH #3:**  
USING UNDERARM  
ANTIPERSPIRANT CAN  
CAUSE BREAST CANCER.



There is no proven link between breast cancer and underarm antiperspirant.

**MYTH #4:**  
CONSUMING TOO MUCH SUGAR  
CAUSES BREAST CANCER.

There is no evidence that high dietary sugar causes breast cancer.



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# BREAST CANCER BREAST SCREENING



## WHY?

Breast screening can discover breast cancers early, when they are too small to see or feel. At this size, they are usually easier to treat (and cure) than larger ones.

Screening detects cancer in ~9 out of 1000 women. In the UK, it reduces the number of deaths from breast cancer by ~1300 a year.



## WHO?

Women aged 50 to 70 are invited for breast screening every 3 years.

After 70, women may request to be screened. Speak to your GP about availability in your local area.



## HOW?

Breast screening takes two x-rays (known as mammograms) of each breast. You have one mammogram from above, and one from the side on each breast. The staff (mammographers) are always female.



## WHAT NEXT?

You will get your results within 2 weeks. If it is normal, you will receive your next appointment for screening 3 years later. If the results aren't clear or shows any abnormal area, you will be called back for more tests.

Please do not worry if you have been called back, it does not mean you definitely have cancer.



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
